



Review of the Port Tariff Methodology 2027/28 - 2029/30

The Ports Regulator is in the process of reviewing the multi-year Tariff Methodology which forms a cornerstone of the ports regulation framework. The Methodology is set for a three-year tariff period, and the current methodology is in its last year of utilisation (applicable to the 2026/27 tariff period). The Regulator has thus published a Discussion Document on the Review of the Tariff Methodology, a Methodology which will be applicable to Tariff Periods 2027/28– 2029/30, and has invited stakeholders to submit written comments and submissions, in response thereto.

The latest iteration of the Methodology, is based on the Revenue Requirement (RR) formula, which provides for the Authority to earn revenues which include a return on capital, a depreciation allowance, OPEX allowance, an allowance for tax expenses, revenue adjustments for performance and a savings component i.e., Clawback and the WEGO.

The Discussion Document considers possible revisions to such elements of the Methodology. The final Tariff Methodology will be published in March 2026, for applicability to future tariff periods.

An invitation is hereby extended to port users and interested parties to attend public hearings on the Review of the Tariff Methodology
